The books about Ringo are all about the things adults think children should learn but which they are perhaps not so good at living up to ourselves.


Martin Sommer is an illustrator, author, animator, graphic designer – and a professional pianist too (playing in the orchestra of Danish musician, Rasmus Seebach).
