SYNOPSIS

Why do adults have children? Ziggy thinks he has found the answer: they do it so that have someone to blame for everything. But if the adults are not completely heartless, they choose to have more than one child, so the children can blame each others – also known as “sibling love”. Unfortunately, Ziggy’s parents only had him, so he has to put up with all kinds of more or less unreasonable accusations.

He is therefore exceedingly happy when he gets a cat. Because cats are not able to tell on you and CutiepieRonaldo is the obvious scape goat for all the things that Ziggy would otherwise bear the brunt for alone.

However, when CutiepieRonaldo one day mistakes Ziggy's bed for the cat tray, it becomes the kick-off for a war on life and death between Ziggy and Kitty Poo – CutiepieRonaldo's new nick name.

Kitty Poo is not prepared to forgive Ziggy for all the unreasonable accusations and with the help from the other pets in the neighbourhood - the conflict shy fighting dog, Killer Karen; the incredibly gluttonous, Peter Pug, and the deceased, Ooze Mouse – Kitty Poo starts a bloody revenge plan which will do Ziggy in, once and for all.

The graphic novel, KITTY POO: REVENGE IS SWEET AND REEKS OF FISH is a crazily funny tale about a teenager and his cunning cat caught in an eternal rivalry.

Winner of *The Best Graphic Novel of the Year Award* by The Copenhagen Libraries, as well as the Orla Prize 2023 in the category "*The Book that made me wet my Pants with Laughing*".

Both the first and second books were nominated for the Ping Prize.

The fourth book is currently nominated for *the Orla Prize*.

SYNOPSIS

Milla and Milla – the two friends with identical names and sense of humour – have enough on their plate. There is Jonas and his girlfriend, Luna, who they simply have to prank. There is the dog, Bobby, who has to learn to play dead. And there is a bathroom that has to be filled with balloons, so Milla's mum has to go and pee in the garden.

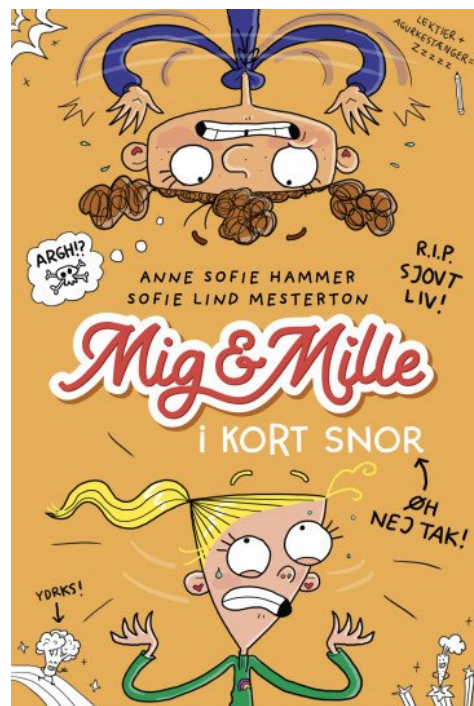

Ruth lives on a small island and there are only seven children in her class. She is the only girl and the others are hanging out in pairs, so she feels a bit left out. She'd love to be friends with Snorre, but he only dares to be her friend when Carl isn't around.

Instead Ruth spends her time collecting insects. But it's not quite the same, as having a good friend. Even if she names them all after people around her and goes to great lengths finding insects that fit the personality of the people in her life.

One day, a dog arrives, alone, with the ferry. A fantastic dog. And it wants to be Ruth's friend. The only challenge is that Ruth's mum hates animals. Oh, and of course there is the small problem that the dog must belong to someone else...

SYNOPSIS

In a house on a hilltop, the autistic boy, Frede, and his older sister are home alone. A violent storm has hit their area and all land around them has been washed away by flooding, leaving their hilltop house on a small island in the sea. They are without electricity and light, waiting for their parents to find them.

Fred's sister does everything in her power to create an illusion that everything is normal – to protect her fragile younger brother. She plays with dinosaurs, makes a cozy camp underneath the dining table, bakes pancakes on the gas fire and tells a fairy tale of a girl who lives in the sea.

At the same time, she is worried and scared. Where are their parents? Will the water rise further? And how does she make the old generator in the outhouse work, so that she can create light and signal to the helicopter above that they are alive and waiting?

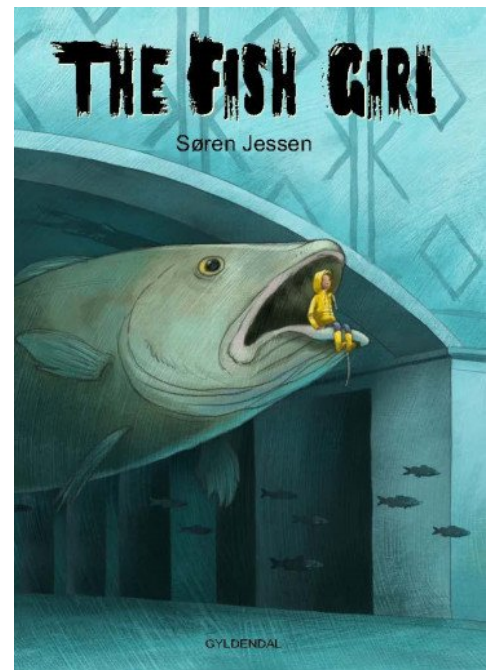
The book provides a beautiful and moving point of departure for a dialogue on climate change and on the importance of caring for each other when the going gets tough. There is a strong sense of hope and community in the story and the stunning illustrations provide a complete extra layer of meaning for this pearl of a story.

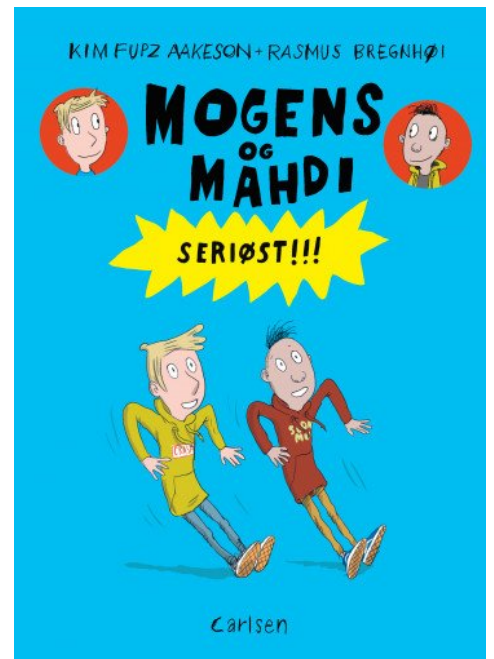
