

Charlotte Pardi (b. 1971) has won the Danish Cultural Ministry's Illustrator Prize on several occasions and is loved for her gentle appealing artwork.

SYNOPSIS

Donna and her brother Little Wee are fully integrated into the family and are enjoying the safety and comfort of their "pack". Up until now, Lillian Betty's father has worked from home and the puppies have therefore been able to have a lie-in and enjoy the peace of the house when the children were in school and daycare. But now he has a new job and Donna and her brother need to go to puppy kindergarten.

Donna is not impressed when she is dragged out of Lillian Betty's bed in the morning - she is not hungry and just wants to sleep. But the worst is that when she gets to the kindergarten it is full of other puppies she does not know. Little Wee blends right in, but Donna needs her time.

However, by the end of the day she has a new friend and when the alarm rings the next morning, Donna is more than ready to go.


Laugh-out-loud "pet horror" in new comic book aimed a 5-8 year-olds.

The artist, **StineStregen**, has earned herself lots of fans with her original, recognisable illustration style.

Bastian desperately wishes for a pet and mum completely agrees. Bastian needs to learn to be a responsible person and a pet is perfect for that. Bastian would ideally like to have a soft, cute rabbit, but mum does not think that is a good pet. A budgie is much better: it is easy to keep and completely innocuous. So that's what they get.

The discussions continue - now it's about the name: Bastian would like to call it Sweet Pea, but mum insists on Chirpy. However, neither Bastian nor the budgie agree on this. Because it turns out that it isn't an ordinary budgie that they have bought. It is a BudgiEVIL and how on earth are you going to escape such a species?


Annette Bjørg is a journalist by profession and has attended the Writing School for Children's Literature in Copenhagen.

It is hard to be Frida, because she doesn't do it on purpose. Fortunately, Grandmother is good at consoling her. And she says that she has once broken something that was much worse: a heart...

The book is warmly and atmospherically illustrated by Signe Kjær, who received the Cultural Ministry's Illustrator Prize in 2021.

Colourful seek-and-find book for the youngest, helping the Dog, Giraffe, Bear and Badger families find all the things they have lost in their homes.


Jørgen Stamp (b. 1969) is a Danish graphic designer and author/illustrator.

SYNOPSIS




SYNOPSIS

SYNOPSIS

Welcome to the world of monsters!

In this book, you will meet 12 creatures whose roots go back a long time. Some of them are more than 2000 years old. Back then, monsters were a natural part of our reality. They gave us a language and helped us to understand some of the emotions that dominated our everyday life.


Feelings like anger, fear, sorrow and glee are all real, even the uncomfortable ones. And space should be given to all of them, as it allows us to show how we really feel.

Even if most of us don't believe in vampires and dragons nowadays, we still create monsters when we don't talk about our feelings. Then we create inner monsters. When we are hiding things, monster-large emotions develop in us and between people – just like in the old days.

If we are honest and talk about our emotions, they are easier to understand and accept and the chance of us being able to let go of them increases.

Meet Mare – the monster of fear, *Blemmya* – the monster of sadness, *Basilisk* – the monster of insecurity and *Krake* – the monster of love.

This book is based on an exhibition – *Monsters: Nasty Creatures with Big Emotions* - which took place in the ruins underneath Christiansborg.



SYNOPSIS

Jamie Penguin loves to build things, but he is not too fond of school. It can be quite difficult for a small penguin to sit still and listen for too long in one sitting. Jamie often gets into trouble, both with his teacher for his lack of focus and with his parents for getting injured during his experiments.

However, Mondays are quite different - on those days, Jamie jumps out of bed to get to school in a flash, because in the first lessons he has "Crafts and Design" and in Britta's lessons everything is allowed and everything is possible. Good thing, because on the weekend, Jamie watched a brilliant program about rockets and he is dead-set on building one for himself ...

SYNOPSIS


It is spring and Little Tree is about to burst into leaf when a small girl comes jumping through the forest. She pulls Little Tree out of the soil and brings it home, so they can live together in the city. The girl is full of good ideas and does everything she can to make sure her new friend is well – but Little Tree becomes weak and starts to fade. What is wrong with Little Tree?

Little Tree is a story about budding friendship between a girl and a little tree which is afraid to grow. It is difficult to play together when you are from different worlds, but perhaps the friendship can form the foundation for a completely new understanding?

A story in pictures about a friendship out of the ordinary, about empathy and the importance of seeing what others need.

Jacinta has developed a special collage technique where nature, paint brush, scissors and paper create a special aesthetic style which encourages children and grown-ups to creativity and play.

SYNOPSIS

In the book, we follow two good friends who have a playdate in a playground. Through play, imagination and conversation, the two children move through some of the many big words in our language and attempt to describe and explain how they understand each of the word. Some of the words covered are "friendship", "courage" and "imagination".

Every page in the book concerns a specific word, with questions and explanations which are meant to spark conversation between the child and the adult. The book also contains illustration sequences that make it suitable for dialogical reading, and it is meant to help develop the linguistic skills of the child along the way. In this way, the curiosity of the child is stimulated, so that he or she actively considers the content of the book and is encouraged to philosophise about the concepts of the book together with an adult.


In his first picture book, Martin Sommer touches on an ever more relevant topic in our modern world in a relatable and accessible way which brings out the smiles in both adults and children.

Martin Sommer is an illustrator, author, animator, graphic designer – and a professional pianist too (playing in the orchestra of Danish musician, Rasmus Seebach).

SYNOPSIS

This is a humorous and relevant book about Ringo who prefers to spend his day behind a screen. Ringo's dad does not think this is a good idea - he will get completely cross-eyed in the end. If Ringo gets 50 cents every time his dad says that sentence, then he'd soon be able to buy an entire house! But Ringo is not rich and he is completely fed up with listening to his dad repeating the same sentence day in and day out.

When Ringo asks his dad what he should do instead, the dad has a lot of good ideas. At least from an adult's point of view. But are they as good from the point of view of a child like Ringo?

And she is really good at it. There is just one problem... even when Flora does her very utmost to make some really good, stinky farts, her friends in the body never says anything nice about them. And neither do the people outside of the body.

One day enough is enough and she leaves her fart laboratory. And sure enough, not long after, chaos rules – because when no one is there to create the farts, the body does not work.

Magic Sight is a timeless and universal picture book about the unconquerable imagination of children and their amazing ability to play, dream and simply be children. Even under the most impossible conditions.

Through her evocative illustrations, **Ane Bjørn** gives form to everything that children (and adults) sometimes find challenging to express with words: dreams, fears, sorrow, anger and imagination.

SYNOPSIS

If you close one eye and cover it with two fingers, you will get magic sight: this is the frame in which Ane Bjørn places her tale of a refugee family and a little girl's insistence to see the beauty of the world in the middle of its horrors.

In a nameless country, in a city in ruins, a girl learns something very special from her grandmother: By covering one eye with two fingers, you can see things, you otherwise don't have an eye for. Wonderful things, you didn't think existed. Golden castles in dark forests. Mermaids in the deep. Beauty, light and hope.

The perilous journey of the family towards a new place is told only through the visuals. The words on the other hand belong to the girl and loyally portray her subjective view of the world around her. A world that contrary to the harsh reality is full of colours and magic, light and hope.



There is a lot of things that Sausage doesn't want and Dad is quite frankly finding it a bit confusing. But, magically, they always end up finding a way to agree.


Oliver Zahle has written a charming picture book series about a little hard-nosed girl and her quirky Dad that is bound to make both parent and child laugh.
